FOREWORD

With a joyful heart I wish to present, with these few lines, the laborious work Brother Carlo Muratori – fra Carletto for friends and scouts – entitled “A Bibliographical Catalogue of Robert Baden-Powell”. This title is followed by an explanatory but at the same time demanding sentence: “Complete bibliographic catalogue of the works in English”. Of course, if the author did not manage to collect all the material written by the British General, he came very close to it!

I am also glad because I saw this work born, and since then I have followed its progress – albeit from a distance. Every book that comes to life is always to be greeted with satisfaction and good wishes, especially as its gestation is long and accurate. This book started off with a work that began many years ago, when its author was preparing his dissertation at the Vatican School of Librarianship. It is there where I first learned about it. I followed its growth and development, until it became the important work that comes to life today.

Robert Smith Stephenson Baden-Powell, Lord of Gilwell (or B.-P. for many scouts) was, as is known, the founder of the Scout Movement, which took shape following the publication of a book, entitled *Scouting for Boys*, initially published in January 1908 in six issues, on a fortnightly basis, and then combined in a single volume in the following May. The immediate success it received continues today with several translations and re-editions. It is truly amazing to count the innumerable editions and reprints that this book has had – the author of this catalogue counts 130 – not only during B.-P.’s life but also after his death. The subtitle of the catalogue explicitly states that only the editions in English are taken into considerations, but we know that *Scouting for Boys* has been translated in almost every language,

becoming a real bestseller – the fourth most sold book in the world over the course of the twentieth century. It ranked just behind works of the calibre of the Bible and the Quran, and even second for books published in English.

If we focus only on the Italian dimension, we can easily see that even in Italy the success of Scouting for Boys has been remarkable. Thousands of copies have been available to scout leaders and young scouts, to get to know the original thought of the founder: from the first “authorised” translation by Mario di Carpegna (the first A.S.C.I. scout leader) in 1920, which was entitled “L'esplorazione per giovani” and re-edited in 1924; to the Salani editions of 1946, when scouting activities resumed after their suppression decreed by the fascist regime; to the numerous editions translated by Fausto Catani and published by Ancora and then Fiordaliso, edited by Mario Sica; up to the 2018 translation by Attilio Greco of the last English edition revised by B.-P., edited by the “Centro Studi ed Esperienze Baden-Powell” – Italian Center for the study of Scout Movement.

Let us come back to us. With perseverance, truly Franciscan, Brother Carlo tracked down and personally analysed almost all the editions, reprints, and facsimile editions of Scouting for Boys, and of other writings of the founder of the Scout Movement, personally collecting a remarkable number. It is a truly bibliographic collection, now generously deposited in the library of the A.G.E.S.C.I. (Association of Italian Catholic Guides and Scouts) headquarters, where it can be easily consulted.

As is known, B.-P., before founding the Scout Movement and in a previous life – as he himself wittily said –, was a brilliant officer in the army of His Britannic Majesty. He quickly climbed all the steps of the military hierarchy, becoming the youngest General. At the same times, he was a brilliant writer, as we can see by skimming through the first pages of this catalogue. In fact, between 1884 and 1908, B.-P. published a number of works mainly devoted to military education and to observation and exploration techniques. As almost a premonition, his first work, an 1884 manual for military education, is entitled Reconnaissance and Scouting.

Baden-Powell was not only a prolific writer, but also an expert illustrator, to the point that very soon the words “Illustrated by the Author” appeared alongside the title of his works – a clear indication that the public also appreciated the undeniable graphic skills of the young British officer. Since his very first service in India, he had begun to collaborate with the London weekly newspaper *The Graphic*, adding sketches and drawings next to his writings. The collaboration with the newspaper continued when he was sent to Africa. From here, during the Anglo-Boer war, he sent periodic reports, which contributed to his fame – he became almost a hero – after the

end of the victorious siege of Mafeking.

Brother Carlo Muratori conveniently excluded from his catalogue the vast number of periodical publications, where the writings of the founder of the Scout Movement are also preserved with equal breadth. But this is different story, awaiting to be written by another eager scholar.

The catalogue, consisting of more than nine hundred bibliographic citations (937, to be precise), is divided into seven chapters that cover the universe of publications by or relating to Baden-Powell. The first chapter is titled “Books” and lists all the works written by B.-P., the re-editions, reprints, facsimile edition, and so on. The second chapter, “Pamphlet”, lists the pamphlets, booklets, and files that contain writings. The third chapter, “Sheet of Paper / Sheet of Dissemination” enumerates the several propaganda and information leaflets written by B.-P.. The fourth chapter, “Collections of articles, citations, or writings”, presents a long list of collections or selections from his various articles, citations, or writings. The fifth chapter, “Books containing writings by Baden-Powell - ”, lists the books which contain substantial parts or entire chapters written by B.-P.. Finally, the last chapter, “Preface to Books”, features a list of volumes, written by third parties, whose preface or foreword is written by B.-P.. Only by considering the difficulties and time needed to identify – I would say discover – third-party books containing writings or prefaces by B.-P., can one evaluate the importance that this catalogue can have for scientific studies on the founder of the Scout Movement and his work.

In each chapter the indication of the work is provided with the name of the author, the title of the work, with any subtitle, the name of the publisher, the place and year of edition, followed by an abbreviation, which indicates where the place the volume is kept, or by a graphic sign [*] which refers to a reference catalogue.

In my opinion, we are faced not only with an excellently-written bibliographic catalogue of an author, but also – to read it carefully – with a work that can help understand moments in the life of that author, the society where he lived, and the very birth of the Scout Movement. Furthermore, although limited to the English editions, by going through these pages it is possible to see how B.-P.’s writings – particularly those relating to the Scout Movement – have spread around the world.

To carry out this work, containing more than nine hundred bibliographic citations, the author had to analysed dozens and dozens of library and publisher catalogues, bibliographic lists, references, and so on, while being careful to avoid false, homonymous, and anonymous documents.

All these searches undoubtedly required a lot of time and perseverance. The result is certainly admirable: any study and research about Baden-Powell cannot ignore the consultation of this catalogue.

INTRODUCTION

Baden-Powell as a writer

Baden-Powell was a very prolific writer. From his *Reconnaissance and Scouting* (1884), a military handbook by a 27-years old captain, to *More Sketches of Kenya* (1940), the last African tales by a old man in his early eighties, his deft, versatile pen churned out no less than 34 books, some 20 booklets and brochures, and countless articles and minor writings.

His style is straightforward and flowing, and his pages have the freshness of the acute remarks with which they are interwoven. Most of his writings reflect his spirit of observation, dynamism, sense of humour, and optimism. It is only natural that such a vast literary production has a very uneven value. Part of it has today only a historical relevance. In 1933, when he had become worldwide famous, he was prevailed upon by his publishers to write his autobiography, “Lessons from the ‘Varsity of Life’”.

Despite his considerable achievements, the Founder of Scouting refused to be put on a pedestal. Like most of his books, this story of his own life is written in a light-hearted, occasionally flippant tone. He always saw life as a game, to be played with scrupulous fairness, and the world as a playing field. It was a game to be played seriously, yet he kept an ironic view of those who take life too seriously, especially in the pursuit of money or career.

He held that life was a God-given gift, and at its end, when shadows lengthen and the “evening comes”, in looking back one should be able to say that one had done one’s best, and that one’s life had been at least partly spent in making others happy. A few remarks about his style. His writings were directed to very different readerships: military authorities and experts in the first stages of his life, then sportsmen, boys, children, Scout leaders, young men, and the general public.

Of course his style adjusts to all these audiences, but it remains faithful to the clarity, straightforwardness and simplicity mentioned above. This explains why several of his military books, written for military reconnaissance and scout training in his African years, were also widely read by boys.

In particular, Baden-Powell's style remains vigorous and concise. His sentences contain no unnecessary words, a paragraph no unnecessary sentences. This does not necessarily make him keep all sentences short, or avoid all details and treat subjects only in outline, but everyone of his words tells.

Contrary to academic (chiefly American) usage, he generally prefers Anglo-Saxon words (shorter) to Latin-derived words (longer), and the words he uses rarely exceed 7-8 letters.

Then his drawings and sketches. Here one can listen to what Baden-Powell himself had to say:

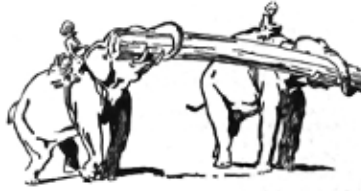
“ I like trying to draw. With me drawing a picture is quite an exciting adventure, for I never know how it is going to turn out. I never learned to draw at school because it was an "extra" and could not be afforded, but I tried to teach myself by studying and copying pictures by artists and noting how they got their effects. (...)

Sketching has the further advantage, in these days of ever-increasing hurry, noise, and materialism, of taking one away out from the roar and bustle of the busy haunts of men to the quiet atmosphere of nature, and steeping one in the beauties and wonders that God has set out for our enjoyment”.

Here Baden-Powell is perhaps too modest. Far from “trying to draw”, he had a special knack for rendering an idea or a feeling by means of a drawing. See for instance the way he depicts the connection between his “two lives” (the General and the Chief Scout):



two very different lives indeed, but linked by the concept of scouting. In another drawing, he illustrates the idea of co-operation, a very valuable concept in both of his lives.



No doubt on the basis of his Indian experiences, he presents two elephant co-operating in carrying a huge log that would probably be too much for each of them separately.
